COVID-19 & 4-H PROGRAM PROTOCOLS

ANNEX ACCESS RESTRICTED

Access to the Latah County Annex building is currently by <u>appointment only</u>. If you need to visit us in-person, please call in advance to setup an appointment at 208 -883-2267. Building policy requires face coverings for entry.

RESTRICTIONS ON GATHERING SIZE

Idaho is in Stage 2 of the Idaho Rebounds Plan in response to COVID:

- Gatherings of more than 10 people are <u>prohibited</u>.
- Any groups of 10 or fewer must adhere to physical distancing and sanitation protocol: Wash hands with soap and water for 20+ seconds; Cover coughs and sneezes; Regularly clean high-touch surfaces and avoid shaking hands; Stay home if you are sick; Wear a face covering in public.
- The emergency health order for the City of Moscow requiring face coverings and physical distancing of 6' remains in effect.

Clubs and project groups, we highly recommend maintaining your meeting schedule and make modifications to a virtual meeting format, rather than canceling. If you have a group of 10 of fewer and need masks, contact our office. We will provide you with disposable masks.

- Login to your 4-H Online account with your existing credentials. Do not create a new account if you are a
 returning member or leader.
- With the 2.0 upgrade, you may be asked to reset your password.
- Update your contact information.
- Update your project list! This helps us plan for fair each year. Be sure to add any new projects to your profile
 and drop any projects you are no longer doing.
- ACTIVATE your enrollment by paying your dues via check, cash, or credit card over the phone:

General Members: \$25 Horse Members: \$30

Leaders: \$5

Family Cap (3+ members): \$75

*Members are not covered by 4-H accident insurance until dues are paid!

HOSTING PERIOD: July 24(arrival) to August 18(departure)

- Host a youth aged 12-18 (majority are 12-14) or an adult chaperone
- Youth have a range of English language abilities, so host families should be prepared to communicate imaginatively

HOST FAMILY REQUIREMENTS

- You must have a child of the same gender who is within 3 years of the hosted youth (children aged 9+ are eligible to host)
- Families without children of the appropriate age may host an adult chaperone
- No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family
- This is a voluntary program; no stipends will be provided

UPCOMING HORSE EVENTS

HORSE IDENTIFICATION PAPERS

Due to Latah County Extension April 15. Every oddnumbered year, all members are required to turn in new/updated papers on their project animal(s). This year ALL horse members are expected to turn in new forms.

If your family has multiple horses that you may ride, we <u>strongly</u> encourage turning in identification papers for all horses by the above deadline. Minimum ownership/lease for horses is 90 days, so you need to have all possible project animals owned/leased and identified with our office by April 15.

GENERAL REMINDERS



Safety Reminder! 4-H members participating in any 4-H equestrian activity must wear an approved helmet whenever they are mounted on an equine or are in a vehicle (cart, wagon,

buggy, etc.) being pulled by an equine. An approved helmet meets the minimum performance standards imposed by the American Society for Testing Materials (ASTM) F1163 and includes certification and labeling required by the Safety Equipment Institute (SEI).

PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide—Idaho uses the PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide. It is a good idea to review this guide every year so you are familiar with the rules and expectations of participating in 4-H Horse Contests. Hard copies are available at Latah County Extension or

you can access it on UI Extension's website.

2021 UI EXTENSION 4-H & BLM WILD HORSE PROGRAM

In 2020, Moscow Mustangs trained a weaning mustang and we are hopeful to see this project again in Latah County in 2021. This is an opportunity cluboriented project, so that multiple youth may benefit from the experience.

Prospective clubs must apply for this opportunity, and 4-H members must be at least 12 years old to be considered to train a weanling or 14 years old to train a yearling. Funds raised through the adoption go back to the club, less \$25, which goes to Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP

Reminder that as you select animal projects for the year that <u>all animal projects</u>, large livestock and small animals, require ownership and/or providing primary care for a specific number of days.

Plan ahead and make sure you are enrolled in 4-H <u>and</u> have your animals secured well in advance.

Days of possession are set at the state level. Refer to the <u>Idaho Project Requirements Handbook</u> for more information.

- 150 days—Market Beef
- 100 days—Market Swine
- 70 days Market Goat and Market Sheep
- 90 days—Llama/Alpaca, Breeding Beef, Pullets/

Laying Hens, Family Flock, Cat, Cavy, Dairy Cattle, Dog, Breeding meat Goat, Dairy Goat, Pack Goat, Pet Goat, Horse, Breeding Rabbit, Pet Rabbit, Breeding Sheep.

- 60 days—Pocket Pet
- 8 weeks—Market Broiler and Market Rabbit

CHIP GILLIAM MEMORIAL PROGRAM

In need of financial assistance for your market project? The Chip Gilliam Memorial Fund is a loan program through the Latah County Fair Office. Since 1997, the loan program has been available to help Latah County youth with financial assistance for their 4-H and FFA market animal projects.

Loan applications are due to the Fair Office March 31, but applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis as funds are available—when in doubt, apply! Applications may only be submitted by Latah County 4-H or FFA members, with approval of their 4-H leader or FFA Advisor.

AREA LIVESTOCK FEED PROGRAMS

As you plan your livestock projects, remember that many businesses in the area offer programs that support youth livestock members. Ask for details next time you visit these businesses.

<u>SPENCE HARDWARE</u>—enroll in the market project program to be eligible for discounts and gift certificates. Inquire now so you don't miss account setup deadlines.

INTERMOUNTAIN FEED—receive 1 free bag of starter feed for your market project when you sign up for their Market Project Program.

NORTH 40 OUTFITTERS—Youth members are eligible for 10% off regular priced feed and show supplements through the Junior Livestock Feed Program.

CHS PRIMELAND—ask about their Rate of Gain program.

LEADER TRAINING

Returning leaders, to maintain your certification for the 2020-2021 4-H year, you must:

- Enroll in the new 4-H year in 4-H Online.
- Complete the 20-minute Protecting Minors Training in 4-H Online during enrollment.
- We recommend a minimum of 2 additional hours of continuing education related to 4-H, youth development, or your project area. Some ideas:
 - * CALS Speaker Series—Temple Grandin lecture. Found on UI website.
 - Stewards of Children—offered through Gritman Medical Center. We will reimburse you the cost of the class if you provide proof of attendance.
 - * Livestock Field Days 2021—Beef 3/20; Swine 3/27; Sheep 4/3; Goat 4/10. All sessions will be held virtually.

Question, Persuade, Refer (Q.P.R.) Suicide Prevention Training

Idaho is one of five western states leading the US in suicide rates. Over 30% of Idaho's youth in grades 9-12 report experiencing feelings of hopelessness or having suicidal thoughts. What can you do? Learn Q.P.R.!

Idaho 4-H Youth Development & Idaho Department of Health and Welfare have partnered to provide Q.P.R. Gatekeeper training to 4-H Volunteers. Q.P.R. is designed to teach others the warnings signs of a suicide crisis and how to respond.
