COVID-19 & 4-H PROGRAM PROTOCOLS

ANNEX ACCESS

Access to the Latah County Annex building is currently by <u>appointment only</u>. If you need to visit us in-person, please call in advance to set an appointment at 208-883-2267. Building policy requires face coverings for entry.

CURRENT PROTOCOL ON GATHERING SIZE

Idaho is in Stage 3 of the Idaho Rebounds Plan in response to COVID. Here is how this impacts 4-H in Idaho:

- Any 4-H club and/or project meeting is limited to a <u>maximum of 50 individuals</u> in any face-to-face setting. This count includes members, volunteers, parents, siblings, etc.
- Please continue taking precautionary measures, including utilizing face coverings/ masks, practicing appropriate physical distancing, and sanitation procedures. Wash your hands, cover coughs/sneezes, regularly clean high-touch surfaces. Anyone who feels sick should stay home.
- The emergency health order for the City of Moscow requiring face coverings and physical distancing of 6' remains in effect.

Thanks to each one of you for your dedication and continued efforts to keep your fellow 4-H members and communities healthy. We can always count of 4-H members to set a good example for others to follow—thank you!

GENERAL 4-H NEWS

ENROLLMENT

All new and returning 4-H members and leaders must be enrolled in the 2020-2021 4-H year. You are not considered a 4-H member until you complete enrollment through 4-H Online and pay your dues.

STEP 1:

- Go to https://v2.4honline.com. Bookmark this page for future access.
- Login to your 4-H Online account with your existing credentials. <u>Do not create a new account if you</u> <u>are a returning member or leader.</u>
- Complete the requested information.
- Please update your project list! We look at your project list each year so we can plan for fair. Be sure to drop any old projects you are no longer participating in and add any new projects.

STEP 2:

 ACTIVATE your enrollment by paying your dues via check, cash, or by credit card over the phone:

> General Members: \$25 Horse Members: \$30

Leaders: \$5

Family Cap (3+ members): \$75

*Members are not covered by 4-H accident insurance until dues are paid!

Not sure what is required of your specific project? Need some project specific resources to get started? Use the project requirement handbook throughout the year to answer your questions!

RECORD BOOKS

ZSuite is Idaho's statewide 4-H record book system. We will be moving into year two of using ZSuite for project record books.

If you are a new 4-H family, or did not complete any projects last year using ZSuite, please plan to set up a family account by visiting https://4h.zsuite.org/.

You can find a step-by-step guide at the end of this newsletter. Members will always have the option to handwrite their record book if they prefer .

NOTE: To be eligible for year-end horse awards, members must participate in at least one county activity, such as Horse Judging or Horse Bowl.

HORSE IDENTIFICATION FORMS

Horse identification forms are due to Latah County Extension April 15. Every odd-numbered year, all members are required to turn in new/updated papers on their project animal(s). This year ALL horse members are expected to turn in new forms.

If your family has multiple horses that you may ride, we <u>strongly</u> encourage turning in identification papers for all horses by the above deadline. Minimum ownership/lease for horses is 90 days, so you need to have all possible project animals owned/leased and identified with our office by April 15.

GENERAL HORSE REMINDERS



Safety Reminder! 4-H members participating in any 4-H equestrian activity must wear an approved helmet whenever they are mounted on an equine or are in a vehicle (cart, wagon,

buggy, etc.) being pulled by an equine. An approved helmet meets the minimum performance standards imposed by the American Society for Testing Materials (ASTM) F1163 and includes certification and labeling required by the Safety Equipment Institute (SEI).

PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide—Idaho uses the PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide. It is a good idea to review this guide every year so you are familiar with the rules and expectations of participating in 4-H Horse Contests. Hard copies are available at Latah County Extension or you can access it on UI Extension's website.

2021 UI EXTENSION 4-H & BLM WILD HORSE PROGRAM

In 2020, Moscow Mustangs participated in this program and trained a mustang. We are hopeful to see this project again in Latah County in 2021. This is a short-term, club-oriented commitment, so that multiple youth may benefit from the experience.

Prospective clubs must apply for this opportunity, and 4-H members must be at least 12 years old to be considered to train a weanling or 14 years old to train a yearling. Funds raised through the adoption go back to the club, less \$25, which goes to Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

How to request this scholarship:

Follow these instructions carefully - It is critical you indicate that you are with Latah County 4-H or you will not receive this scholarship!

- 1. Open the registration link http://bit.ly/2021livestockfielddayregistration
- 2. Fill out the requested information.
- 3. When you get to the payment section, check the boxes for 'Scholarship' AND 'Other'. In the 'Other' field, you must type 'Latah County 4-H'.

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP

Reminder that as you select animal projects for the year that <u>all animal projects</u>, large livestock and small animals, require ownership and/or providing primary care for a specific number of days. Plan ahead and make sure you are enrolled in 4-H <u>and</u> have your animals secured well in advance.

Days of possession are set at the state level and can be referenced in the *Idaho Project Requirements Handbook*.

LIVESTOCK IMPORT REMINDER



As you confirm plans to bring home your project animals, remember that Idaho State Dept. of Agriculture has import requirements for all market and breeding livestock entering the state.

This is not new—these rules apply to anyone, including 4-H & FFA youth, who are bringing livestock into the state. An essential part of being a responsible livestock producer is understanding and following these rules. Please review the ISDA Quick Reference on page 8 for species-specific information.

MARKET LIVESTOCK TAGGING/WEIGH-IN

- Beef—Saturday, April 17, Monson Barn—UI Campus, 7:00 AM—9:30 AM.
- **Swine**—Ownership by Monday, June 1. Leaders must have animals tagged and records submitted to Extension office by June 7.
- Sheep & Goat—Monday, June 28, Latah County Fairgrounds, 3:00 PM—6:30 PM.

4-H members must have paid annual enrollment dues and be 'Active' in 4-H Online by their respective species tagging/weigh-in date.

To ensure consistency between programs, members should be prepared to designate their primary project animal and floater as either 4-H or FFA at designated county tagging/ weigh-in events and deadlines.

CHIP GILLIAM MEMORIAL PROGRAM

In need of financial assistance for your market project? The Chip Gilliam Memorial Fund is a loan program through the Latah County Fair Office. Since 1997, the loan program has been available to help Latah County youth with financial assistance for their 4-H and FFA market animal projects.

Loan applications are due to the Fair Office March 31, but applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis as funds are available—when in doubt, apply! Applications may only be submitted by Latah County 4-H or FFA members, with approval of their 4-H leader or FFA Advisor.

RABBIT HEMORRHAGIC DISEASE

The Idaho Department of Fish and Game (IDFG) and Idaho State Department of Agriculture (ISDA) announced the confirmation of Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) found in two wild jackrabbits in Ada County on 3/26/21. This is first case of RHD identified in wild or domestic rabbits in Idaho and is a highly contagious and often deadly virus in rabbits.

ISDA is not asking domestic rabbit shows or exhibitions be cancelled at this time. Please be aware and enhance your biosecurity practices to protect your rabbits. For more information, visit https://agri.idaho.gov/main/rabbit-hemorrhagic-disease/

WATERFOWL AT 2021 FAIR

Idaho State Department of Agriculture has advised waterfowl not be housed or exhibited at county fairs to decrease transmission of Avian Influenza. Per this guidance, the Latah County Fair will not be accepting waterfowl entries in 2021.



LEADER'S CORNER

PROSPECTIVE LEADERS

Anyone interested in becoming a certified 4-H leader must complete the leader application, background check, and interview process required for certification; and have a profile set up in 4-H Online.

RETRUNING LEADERS

Returning leaders, to maintain your certification for the 2020-2021 4-H year, you must:

- Enroll in the new 4-H year in 4-H Online.
- Complete the 20-minute Protecting Minors Training in 4-H Online during enrollment.
- Complete 2 hours of continuing education related to 4-H, youth development, or your project area. If you are taking a training through your employer or other volunteer commitment that you think might apply to your work as a 4-H volunteer, contact our office to ask about it.

MEETING ATTENDENCE

This time of year, our office receives a lot of questions from leaders about club and project meeting attendance. Page 10 of <u>Idaho 4-H Policies and Procedures</u> specifies that members must attend the <u>majority</u> of scheduled club and project meetings.

- Establish your meeting schedule well in advance so members can put dates on their calendars.
- Knowing the total number of meetings in advance helps families plan ahead and assists you as a leader in holding members accountable for their attendance.

Per Policies and Procedures, regular 4-H clubs should be meeting 6 or more times per year. Project leaders can determine the total number of meetings they wish to schedule and whether they want to set more strict attendance requirements than the minimum required majority attendance.

Livestock Import Rules Apply to 4-H and FFA Animals

As you begin selecting animals for your 4-H & FFA projects for the upcoming fair season, please keep in mind that <u>all</u> import rules for livestock apply to animals brought into Idaho that will be used as 4-H and FFA market and breeding animals. Below is a quick reference (as of 2/6/2019) for each species. For a complete listing of import requirements, please go to the ISDA website at:

Cattle:

- > Castrated male cattle (steers) must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) from a licensed veterinarian with a full physical address of the origin and destination.
- > Intact female beef cattle must have a CVI with the full physical address of the origin and destination. Female cattle 4 months and older require vaccination for Brucellosis with their legible tattoo recorded on the CVI. Female cattle 18 months and older require individual, official identification listed on the CVI. Female calves accompanying their dam may enter without vaccination.
- > All intact dairy cattle must have a CVI with the full physical address of the origin and destination and an entry permit.

 Female cattle 4 months and older require vaccination for Brucellosis with their legible tattoo recorded on the CVI. All dairy females 6 months of age and older are required to have a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days before entering Idaho. Individual, official identification must also be listed on the CVI.
- > Brand Inspections required on all cattle (even if unbranded.) For information on Brand Inspections please call the Idaho State Brand Department Lewiston District Office at 208-799-5019.

Horses:

- > CVI with full physical address of the origin and destination. Six month equine passports are accepted from states participating in Global Vetlink's EECVI program. Negative EIA (Coggins) test required within 12 months prior to entering Idaho.
- > Brand Inspections required on all horses (even if unbranded.) For information on Brand Inspections please call the Idaho State Brand Department Lewiston District Office at 208-799-5019.

Sheep and Goats:

- > Castrated male sheep and goats (wethers) CVI with full physical address of the origin and destination and an entry permit from the Idaho Sheep and Goat Health Board (contact: Brandy Kay at 208-803-5084).
- > Intact female sheep and goats must have a CVI with full physical address of the origin and destination and an entry permit from the Idaho Sheep and Goat Health Board (contact: Brandy Kay at 208-803-5084). Scrapies tag, tattoo (if recorded on Breed Registry papers), or other official, individual identification recorded on CVI.
- > Intact male sheep and goats must have a CVI with full physical address of the origin and destination and an entry permit from the Idaho Sheep and Goat Health Board (contact: Brandy Kay at 208-803-5084). Scrapies tag, tattoo (if recorded on Breed Registry papers), or other official, individual identification recorded on CVI.
- > All dairy type goats over 6 months of age need a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days before entering Idaho.
- > All intact male sheep over 6 months of age must have a negative Brucella ovis test within 30 days before entering Idaho.
- > All sheep and goat CVI's must also state that listed animals are free from Scrapie (known to have not been exposed for at least 72 months prior to date of inspection), Scabies (known to not have been exposed for at least 6 months immediately prior to date of inspection), Foot Rot, Brucella and do not have any symptoms of any communicable diseases (known to have not been exposed to any communicable disease for at least 30 days immediately prior to date of inspection.)

Hogs:

- > All swine entering Idaho require a CVI with the full physical address of the origin and destination and an entry permit.

 Individual, official identification must be listed on the CVI. The following statements must also be on the CVI; Raw Garbage Statement, PRV Statement and a PEDv Statement.
- > All breeding swine not originating from a Brucellosis free herd or a Brucellosis free state must have a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days of movement into Idaho.

<u>Registration</u> is required by **April 26, 2021**. Model horse show will be canceled if there are fewer than 10 entries received at the Latah County Extension office by the deadline.

Entries will be accepted at 12 pm the day of show <u>only</u> if the model horse show already has 10 entries. **Please get your entries in early.**

Things you need to know:

- A model horse show is like a regular horse show, but for model horses... like Breyers.
- Horses should be clean and free of dust.
- Horses should be entered in appropriate classes and may enter in more than one class.
 Tack and Riders Optional.
- If tack and/or rider are used, appropriate tack and dress for class/event should be used. Please read the class descriptions for more information.
- Horses will be judged as horses in a regular horse show. Please read the class descriptions for more information.
- There are three divisions of classes: Stablemate, Classic & Traditional.
 - ➤ Stablemates are approximately 4" long x 3" high.
 - ➤ Classics are approximately 9" long x 6" high. Breyer Paddock Pals are included in the Classic division.
 - Traditionals are approximately 12" long x 9" high.
 - ➤ Ponies © Breyer should be entered in Class 28 Grand Finale class
- Winners Circle Photo area will be available, so bring your cameras!

How it Works:

There will be three arenas (tables), while one is being judged, one will be setting up and the other will be cleaning up. The judge will move from table to table. It is the contestants' responsibility to set up their horses for the next class and remove their display from the last class promptly. Barns or tables space will be available for each member to prepare their entries.

Rules:

- Show is open to all currently enrolled 4-H members and <u>4-H family</u> members.
- One entry per class
- Entry must have entry number

- Model may be entered in more than one class.
- Tack & rider not required or considered in judging.
- Props are NOT allowed except in Halter, Other Performance, Jumping, Racing, and Scene Classes. No props are allowed for the costume class.
- All awards are final.
- Exhibitors are responsible for set up & removal of models before and after each class.
- Parents may assist children with entries as needed. Parents may NOT help children with Scene or Costume class set up.

Awards:

- First through sixth place awards will be given for each class.
- A Championship Class will be held for each division (Stablemate, Classic & Traditional). Any horse receiving a First Place award in any class (except classes # 28, 29, 30, 31) are eligible to enter the Division Championship class. Awards or ribbons will be given in each division First through Sixth place.
- The First & Second place winners of each Division Championship class will be eligible to enter the Overall Grand Champion class. Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion will be awarded to the top two horses in this overall class.
- The judge's decisions are final.

Division Age champion/reserve participants (cloverbud, junior, intermediate, senior) winners are determined from all 31 classes by a point system (1st = 6 points, 2nd = 5 points, 3rd = 4 points, 4th = 3 points; 5th = 2 points; and 6th = 1 point). Cash awards will be given to the **FOUR** Champion and Reserve age participants as long as a donor for this award is secured.

Champion Classes to follow - Classes # 28, 29, 30, and 31 are not eligible for Champion Classes. There will be a special award or ribbon for Class #30 and #31.

- 32. All STABLEMATE model 1st place class winners on table 1 (9 classes).
- 33. All CLASSIC model 1st place class winners on table 2 (9 classes)
- 34. All TRADITIONAL model 1st place class winners on table 3 (9 classes).

Overall Grand Champion Model Horse Show participant winner - The first and 2nd place winners from classes # 32, #33, and #34. Awards to Grand and Reserve overall winners.

Class Descriptions

Halter: Any horse not in motion. Horse should be standing with feet placement square. Halters may be worn, but not required.

Pleasure: Any horse moving in natural motion. Horse should appear to be a pleasure to ride.

Jumping: Any horse in an over fences position. Props may be included.

Other Performance: Any horse performing but not limited to: Cutting, Roping, Barrel Racing, Dressage, Reining, Gaited, etc. These horses can be shown in appropriate dress and/or tack for English or Western. Props are encouraged and may be included.

Mare & Foal: Any Mare/Foal set. Mare/Foal can be shown separately in other classes like the foal class or other classes.

Draft: Any horse considered a draft breed. Horses can be in motion or standing.

Race Horse: Any race horse model, old to new racing horse competitors or winners as well as other race horses. This also includes pacers and trotter horses. Models may be in a standing or moving pose. Horses in this class may wear their flowers, blankets or silks.

Misbehaving: Any horse behaving badly, such as rearing, bucking, kicking, and baulking.

Grand Finale Class (two entries per participant). Please note same placing as other classes 1st thru 5th: This class is includes Fantasy, Winged, Favorite injured/lame horse, other Breyer models not fitting into other classes offered (wildlife, farm, household pets, etc.), Ponies, and other horses like toy horses, stuffed, or models that are not Breyer. Clay can be used to support the injured/lame horse and will be judged as though they are not broken. Some examples of the injured/lame horse entries are: broken legs, ears & tails, severe scratching, fading & rubs, or warped or twisted legs. Ponies could be the washable kind that can be colored on or other ponies from sources other than Breyer. Fantasy or Winged entries can be unicorns, different colors of horses with or without designs, and winged sparkly colored horses of any size.

Series or Collection: Any group of three or more of the same mold or a Breyer Series.

Costume: Dress your horse up, be original, & creative. All models accepted, only one entry per participant. Costume must be on horse, <u>No Other Props</u>. Class will be judged on creativity and originality.

Scene: Create a scene using one or more models combined with props, decorations & back drops. Scene must fit in a 24 in x 18 in area. All models allowed. Class will be judged on creativity & attention to detail.







- <u>Upcoming Events</u> from your club, county, state and ZSuite


From this screen you will access all other features of your new ZSuite Account.

- Logout: Log all of your family profiles out of the system.




STEP 5: Create your child(s) accounts.


- From the <u>Dashboard</u>, click <u>Household Members</u>

 Fill in first name, last name, mark <u>Role</u> as "Club Member", add birthdate. Then click the green "+ADD CLUB" button.




o Choose your club from the drop-down menu, click the blue "ADD CLUB" Button






- o If your child is active in multiple clubs, click the green "+ADD CLUB" button and repeat this step as many times as necessary to add all clubs to their profile.
- o Once all clubs have been added to this child's profile. Click the blue "SAVE" button on the *New Household Member* Screen.




STEP 6: Repeat all of **STEP 5** until all children and adult club volunteers have been added to the *Household Members* Screen.










STEP 9: Click Record Books on the left side menu.



STEP 10: Click the green "+ RECORD BOOK" button.



- **Project Name:** Use a name relevant to the project such as "Market Swine" or "Cake Decorating".
- Club: Choose the club that you will be completing this project in.
- **Primary Category:** Select your age division, based on your age as of January 1, 2020.
- **Sub-Category**: Choose the book you need to complete for this project.
 - o **Animal**: Any project that has a heartbeat uses this book.
 - General/Non-Animal: Any project that does not have a heartbeat.
 - Involvement Report: Your life-long 4-H record of activities and events.
 - Secretary: If you are a club secretary, use this record to keep track
 of your club meetings, attendance and events.
 - Treasurer: If you are a club treasurer, use this record to keep track
 of your club finances, auditing and reporting.
- Record Book Type: Only applies to Animal Record Books. Choose Breeding/Pet or Market Animal.
- Start Date: October 1 of each year.
- End Date: September 30 of each year.


STEP 11: Click the blue "SAVE" button.

STEP 12: Repeat **STEP 10 and 11** as many times as necessary to add all record books and one (1) involvement report per child.


PRO TIP: Per Idaho 4-H Requirement Handbook, every 4-H member in Idaho must maintain their Involvement Report for their entire 4-H experience.



STEP 13: Click the yellow link under <u>Project Name</u> to access that record. Click the blue pencil under "Edit" if you wish to edit the name, type, or age division associated with that record.



STEP 14: You can now edit the tabs (pages) of your record book by clicking on the tabs located in the left menu.



STEP 15: Once you have completed entering all of your data. Click the "Record Book" tab at the bottom of the left-hand menu to download for printing or to submit your

completed record book.

PRO TIP: Save your record book after each update by clicking "Record Book" then choose "Download" and save to your computer or device as a backup.
