We are already a month into the new 2022/2023 4-H year, and the first 4-H Leaders Council meeting of the year is on Monday, November 28th! The November meeting is the officer election meeting (this year for vice president and treasurer) as well as the meeting where, in even-numbered years, By-Law revisions are presented to the council (January meeting is where revisions to By-Laws may be adopted).

What is the 4-H Leaders Council? Under the direction and authority of UI Extension, 4-H Leaders Council is the countywide forum for 4-H Youth Development volunteer leaders to discuss ideas and provide input to enhance U of I Extension 4-H Youth Development programs at the county and local level. The Council also funds awards such as Latah County 4-H Livestock Judging awards and end of year Latah County 4-H awards. The council has also granted thousands of dollars, over the years, in travel grants to local 4-H members who successfully applied for and attended approved 4-H activities.

Why should you attend the 4-H Leaders Council meetings? Council meetings are an excellent opportunity to exchange ideas, bring YOUR time and talent to the table and be kept up to date on the 4-H activities in the county and state. Have new ideas, questions or suggestions for improvement? If you are willing to present your thoughts and/or participate in implementation, this is the forum to do so.

Who should attend the 4-H Leaders Council meetings? Leader's council meetings are open meetings, and therefore are open to all, however only certified leaders are voting members.

I'd like to personally invite existing leaders, parents or anyone with an interest in helping to "Make the Best Better" to attend the meetings. Meetings are held the evening of the fourth Monday of every other month at the Latah County Fairgrounds in Moscow (Horse Leaders 5:30, Animal Leaders 6:00, Leaders Council 6:30).
